Drop in sink



"We need a craftsman for rough cuts in our solid surface countertop to replace our under-mount sink with a drop-in model. The cuts will be concealed by 1" flanges, so no on-site polishing is needed. The new sink will be available for exact measurements. It's a simple drop-in sink with 1" flanges on all sides, requiring a rectangular cut larger than the existing opening. Faucet holes are pre-drilled in the sink's rear deck, so no drilling in the countertop is needed. Thank you"

Retrofit Top Mount



"We need a reliable craftsman for rough cuts in our solid surface countertop for a drop-in retrofit farm sink installation. The cuts will be hidden by 1" flanges, so no onsite polishing is needed. The sink will be available for precise measurements. You'll create an opening, potentially larger than the existing one, with no faucet holes required. The critical cuts are on the countertop overhang, they need to be slightly longer than the sink's apron to allow it to slide through without cutting cabinetry. Simply remove the false drawer fronts to fit the sink. Thank you."

Note: You are not limited to granite fabricators for your project. Tile setters, handymen, and anyone skilled in using an angle grinder with a diamond blade can perform this work effectively. Despite concerns that cutting stone may cause cracking, our experience over 25 years shows that hundreds of customers have successfully replaced their sinks without any issues.
